CLASSES 1 & 2

The children in Classes 1 and 2 loved singing with Mr Becker on Tuesday morning. They learnt a song about animals and some actions to go with it. Toby said" God gave me lips to eat my chips" was the funniest part of the song!





The children in Class 1 have enjoyed learning about Arctic Explorers this week. On Friday they dressed up as animals you might find if you were trekking through the Arctic snow.

FOREST SCHOOL

This week Mr Blackwell taught the children in Reception and Year 1 all about planting bulbs and they planted some crocuses along the sheep garden wall.

It will be very exciting to see them grow over this Spring term! The children also used some tools, creating some wooden jewellery and baked some delicious soups, cakes and pies in the mud kitchen!

They were worthy of a Paul Hollywood handshake! Some children also created a brilliant bug hotel, but they said that unfortunately room service wasn't available.

We look forward to our trip to the woods with Mr Blackwell next Monday!

CLASS 4



This week, class 4 have enjoyed using drama in their English lessons. Throughout the week, we have been using facial expressions, body language and emotive language to describe how characters from our story may feel at any point. This was to understand how authors are able to show you how the character is feeling rather than tell you. A great literary device that we continuously show in the real world.

CLASS 3

In computing this week, the focus was to look at how important accuracy is within computing. We started by following instructions on our whiteboard. We noticed that we need to say which direction we want to go and how far. For sample, left, right, up down etc. we then went outside and went from one place on the playground to the other with our partners. One partner had their eyes closed and the other gave directions. This showed the children just how important it is to be accurate and specific in programming.





In geography this term, Class 3 are looking at rivers and the water cycle. For our first lesson, we went into the garden and looked at which way water would travel when poured onto different surfaces. We noticed that on the grass, the water went down through the grass. This helped us with our learning and understanding that water always travels downhill.



COLLECTIVE WORSHIP

During collective worship the children thought about the value joy. Mrs Stallard shared with the children the Bible text John 8:12 where Jesus said "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness but will have the light of the life". The children enjoyed choosing a variety of candles lit by Mrs Stallard to represent every one of our Malborough family being unique and different but all having the same flame. Just as Jesus brought light and joy to many people, the children were asked to think about how they will bring joy to people this week.

DEVON LIVING CHURCHYARDS PROJECT

On Wednesday the Eco Club went to the church to join a group of fellow environmentalists who are interested in 'Rewilding' the Churchyard as part if the 'Devon Living Churchyards Project'.

There was a representative from Exeter Diocese who gave a speech on the importance of looking after 'God's garden'. The children learnt about how churchyards can be used to support wildlife and protect dying ecosystems.



This is going to be an ongoing project for the children to think about and it is wonderful to be linking our school with the church, the SMASH group and the wider community.



150th ANNIVERSARY

As part of our 150th Anniversary celebrations, we are holding a competition for the children to create a logo which can be used throughout the year.
