
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
Dear Parents and Carers

CLASS NEWS

This week in Class 4 PSHE we have been discussing stereotypes within school, the wider community and throughout time. We looked at how stereotypes begin at an early age with the toys that we are given and the clothes that we wear. We then discussed how this formulates stereotypical views and beliefs as we get older.





We looked at jobs, clothing, toys and sports and how these have all been affected by gender stereotypes. We then created adverts to sell a brandnew toy that was unisex and could hold no stereotypes.

FOREST SCHOOL


This week the Year 3 children enjoyed a sunny morning in the woods and were joined by SMASH members to help plant young trees which were donated by the Devon Tree Foundation. Hazel, rowan, alder, lime, holly and whitebeam trees were planted, and the children can keep an eye on them when they are at their weekly forest school sessions.





In science, Class 3 looked at 'pitch' and 'volume'. We learnt about high pitch and low pitch and the sound waves that represent these. The children conducted a test where they predicted which glass of water would have the high pitch and which the low pitch. With different levels of water in each glass, the children then had to test out their predictions by tapping on the glass and listening to which was high pitch, and which was low pitch.

In maths, Year 4 has been looking at multiplying by 10 using a place value chart. We made this a practical lesson by giving the children numbers and having a place value chart represented by hundreds, tens and ones. The children had to move in the chart to represent the number being multiplied by 10.



SWIM FESTIVAL



We teamed up with a part of our federation family from Stokenham Area Primary School. The children all had positive attitudes and were very happy to get stuck in. Well done to everyone who took part!

This week, the South Hams Federation attended the South Hams School Games Swimming Festival. Three children from our school took part in the event. This festival included a variety of games where the children had to work as a team and complete relay races and ball games.
