### TREASURE HUNT



# LOLLIPOP STICK MATHS!

In maths this week, Year 3 has been looking at remainders. To help the children, we used manipulatives. These weren't ordinary manipulatives, they were lollipop sticks. The children were asked to divide one number by another and used the lollipop sticks to help them make the shapes. For example, 25 divided by 3. The children knew they had to create groups of 3 so made triangles. The left-over lollipop sticks that didn't make a shape, we knew were the remainders.



### LOVE



This week our focus in collective worship has been 'love' and the children have been thinking about what love is and especially what they are grateful for.

Their thoughts and prayers are displayed in St Peter's and All Saints Church.

In our whole school church service this week, we discussed St. Valentine and Valentine's Day. This included sharing how we show and receive love.

Children shared their ideas on how to be kind to one another inside and outside of school.

We then talked about how we can make sure everyone feels loved by committing small acts of kindness.



Trevor read a verse from the Bible (Corinthians 13:4) describing what love is and what love is not: 'Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonour others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs'.

# FOREST SCHOOL



### Boys

Embroidered white polo shirt and red sweatshirt Navy, grey or black trousers or tailored shorts Black shoes (leather or leather-look), not trainers, trainer-style or canvas. No logos.

#### Girls

Embroidered white polo shirt and red sweatshirt
Grey or black skirt, trousers or tailored shorts
Red Gingham Summer Dress
Tights must be a dark colour (navy, grey or black)
Black shoes (leather or leather-look), not trainers, trainer-style or canvas. No logos.

In accordance with the Local Authority requirements on health and safety, we do not allow children to wear jewellery. The exceptions to this rule are small, simple studs in pierced ears, small objects of religious significance and wristwatches. Smart watches are strictly prohibited.


