ASH WEDNESDAY

On Wednesday we held our Ash Wednesday Service in the church. It was lovely to welcome back Father Daniel, who has been away on sabbatical.

Ash Wednesday is the beginning of Lent, a time for reflection. Father Daniel explained that the palms from last year's Palm Sunday Service are burnt and the ash from this is used to make the sign of the cross on Christians' foreheads.





CYBER SECURITY

On Thursday Class 4 were visited by PCs Simon Cooper and Rob Irving to discuss cyber security, social media, internet safety and cyber bullying. The children were quite surprised at the age at which people are allowed to use apps like Snapchat and WhatsApp.





At the end of the presentation the officers challenged the children with a guiz that had different scenarios.

The children had to run to the area of the classroom designated for the answer. They had remembered all of information they had been given and they now know how to

keep safe online and what to do if they have a concern. The children asked lots of questions, Hunter asked, "What do you have in your police bag?" and Amelie wanted to know what the officers first ever job in the police was and has policing changed since the officers trained.

This week class one had a special visitor for their eye test! ROMANS IN DEVON

This week, Class 3 visited the RAMM museum to learn about Romans in Devon. This was used as a pre-teaching opportunity before the children learn about the Romans in the summer term. The learning activities were amazing! The children were able to dress up as Roman civilians as well as Roman soldiers. We designed our own oil lamps which we learnt were used for light and to worship the gods.



The children were also given a tour of the museum where they were shown a variety of Roman artefacts that were found in Exeter!

After which they were shown lots of different foods and accessories the Roman would use in their daily lives.



Finally, the children learnt about mosaics and how to write their name in Latin which is the language the Romans used.

The children were very well behaved all day and enjoyed visiting the museum and seeing all of the incredible artefacts.

LITERACY IN ACTION
