SCHOOL LUNCH MENU 2 Week beginning Monday 31st October

Thank you to all of you who have been logging-on to Parent Pay and ordering your child's lunches in advance. We apologise for the issues you have been experiencing this week with the Parent Pay system. We hope that this will all be rectified as soon as possible. In the meantime, please would you log-on to the system before 8.00am each day to order your child's meal.

Please would you ensure that you pay for your child's school lunches in advance as we are not permitted to allow lunch accounts to accrue any debt. If you are unable to pay by credit or debit card, please let Mrs Roberto in the school office know and she will activate a bar code Pay Point letter for you which you can take to any Pay Point (e.g. Post Office) and pay for your child's school lunches by cash or cheque.

ATTENDANCE

It is a government legal requirement that all children attend school for 190 days each academic year. The government requirement is that we monitor attendance and apply the legal requirement. The South Hams Federation is striving to achieve our goal of 98% attendance; it is our policy that no child's attendance should fall below 98% in order for this to happen. Our Federation recognises that good attendance is central to raising standards and pupil attainment.
