Our Year 5 children enjoyed their first sailing session this week with Salcombe Dinghy Sailing.




Unfortunately, the sun didn't make an appearance and the weather was damp and windy, but everyone had a great time and they are all looking forward to their second lesson next week.




The children in Class 1 have had great fun this week in their Maths and Computing lessons this week. We can see from all their smiley faces how much they have been enjoying their learning.

Despite YouTube Kids seeming like a very child-friendly platform, it has raised concerns over its advertising and SETTING UP inappropriate content seeping through the curation process. Download the YouTube Kids app and connect your own YouTube channel. Input your child's name, age and birth month. OSCAR Select the types of videos you want to include for your child based on their age and your own personal choice. If you decide to approve the content yourself, the app will present you with sample videos for you to accept and reject. Once you've made your choice, you're ready to use the app! Advice for Parents & Carers BE WARY OF UNSUITABLE CONTENT REMOVE ADVERTISEMENTS Like YouTube, adverts on YouTube Kids are quite pervasive. If you decide you don't wa child being exposed to adverts, you can so to YouTube Premium which will remove ad YouTube Kids. However, it's worth rememb that this doesn't block adverts that conten creators decide to make as part of their co and children are still able to access channe from branded fast food or toy companies. The YouTube Kids app provides you with the option of setting up a timer to monitor and limit your child's daily usage, which automatically stops the video when it reaches the set time.
