The children also got the chance to design some letters like the monks would have done by incorporating animals into a letter of their choice. The children visited the monks' kitchen and saw what they would use to prepare their food and identify some interesting parts of the kitchen. The children learnt about the patterns in the windows of the cathedral and that most windows have three circles to represent the Holy Trinity. 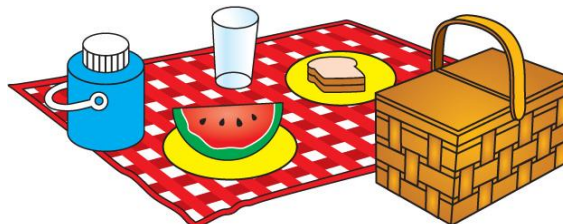

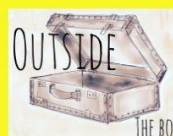
