We found woodlice, spiders, snails, worms, flies, beetles, ladybirds and a bumblebee even landed in Mrs Nixon's hair! The children used their scientist skills to check off different creatures and habitat features from their list and had a go at segmenting and writing the name of the minibeast too.











Class 2 has been looking through the lenses of biologists! Bug collecting for observational drawing in Science. The children had great fun collecting Wood Lice, Worms and Beetles in their petri dishes and taking them into class for a thorough examination before returning them to their habitats.



This week in Class 4 the children have been writing their 'Where my wellies take me' drafts. Writing in the style of Michael Morpurgo about a local walk that they enjoy.




