## Curriculum Overview 2023-24 Year 5 and 6

#### **English**

#### **English**

In English class 4 are reading 'How The Whale Became - by Ted Hughes'. We will be writing our own stories on how an animal came into being, engaging our imagination on a fantastical story of an animal's existence.

#### **Guided Reading**

Throughout both terms, the children will have 5 daily sessions focusing on reading, vocabulary, inference, predictions, explaining, retrieving and exploring author choice and hidden themes. We will also be exploring a class novel and looking at vocab choice and foreshadowing. Our novel this term is Who Let The Gods Out?

Summer 1: Les jeux Olympics? In this topic, the children will explore the world of Olympics looking at both the modern and the ancient games.

Children will learn how to describe the clothes that they wear on a day to day basis.

#### Maths. Year 5

## Shape, Position and Direction, Decimals and Converting units

The children will cover a wide range of topics this term. The children will look at regular and irregular polygons, angles within shapes and rotation and reflection of shapes. They will also start to use their knowledge of decimals to multiply and add up to 1 decimal place.

## Year 6: Statistics, Algebra, position and direction

The Year 6s will be looking at shape; understanding angles within polygons, translating, rotating and reflecting shapes. They will then be looking at statistics; finding the mean and reading and interpreting a number of different graphs/charts.

# Summer 1: Living things and their habitats: Life cycles of plants and animals

In this topic, the children will learn about the life cycles within living things.

They will learn that some living organisms reproduce sexually and some asexually. They will learn the life cycle of amphibians and insects; flowering plants; birds and mammals and plants.

#### Summer 2: Human growth

Children will begin to explore changes humans experience from conception to old age.

#### Summer 1: Jesus as King

Children will learn about how Christians view Jesus as a servant king.

## Summer 2: How does faith help people in their lives?

The children will discuss varying religious views from around the globe and look to answer the question 'How does religion help people through difficult times?'

#### **PSHE**

#### Summer 1 & 2: In the wider world

The children will be looking at how they fit into the wider world as they grow up.

We will look at topics of money management, conflict resolution, diversity among other topics.

## P.E. Summer 1: Athletics.

Children will learn about athletics and the varying running, jumping and throwing events that make the sport exciting to watch and compete in.

#### **Spring 2: Athletics and swimming**

Children will carry on with athletics as well as follow the in-school swimming session that aims to provide the children with the necessary swimming skills to keep them fit and safe in water.

#### **History**

The children will be learning about the development of life in Benin. They will be exploring artefacts and resources that open up what life was like in Benin and in the wider context of African history as a whole.

#### Geography

The children will learn about The Alps and deepening their current knowledge by looking at both human and physical geographies of the region.

## Art and Design Technology. Summer 1: Land and city scapes

Exploring the different elements that go into create a 'set design' for a theatre performance. They will be studying War Horse and using elements from the set design to inspire their work.

#### **Summer 2: DT - Cooking**

The children will be learning about food from Latin America and look at skills needed to make a flavoursome, savoury dish.

#### Music

Summer 1: We will be exploring rap/hip hop music and how music can be a powerful inspiration for change.

Summer 2: The children will learn about pop music and how it has developed over the years and how it is ever changing.

#### Computing

<u>Summer 1:</u> The children will be looking at creating media using online software.
